



HOMELAND SECURITY TRAINING PROGRAM

REPORT TO THE COUNCIL

During the months of March, April and May 2014 the Homeland Security Training Coordinator focused on the following areas and provided the following training:

Focus Areas:

- Providing standard ICS training to stakeholders.
- Coordinating with various training providers to deliver non-ICS courses in Vermont.
- Implementing evaluation program for Homeland Security Training Program.
- Managing, enhancing, and coordinating ICS Instructor cadre.
- Coordinating ICS Train the Trainer course to expand cadre of qualified instructors.
- Coordinating Position Specific classes.
- Participating in the 2014 National Training & Exercise Symposium.
- Attending Instructor Development courses to identify areas for improvement in program.
- Coordinating MOU close out and budgeting.
